



## **Guiding Principles for Choosing Subcommittee Members**

1. Provides specific knowledge or expertise relevant to the work of the Subcommittee
2. Well known in Oregon and generally well respected in this topic area
3. Able to articulate a "big picture" perspective beyond the narrow group they represent.
4. Understands the inter connectedness of Subcommittee work
5. Experience with multiple systems, populations, geographic areas etc.
6. Adds ethnic, regional, economic or religious diversity that allows the work of the Commission to be as representative of the State of Oregon as possible.

### Logistical Factors to consider:

- Group size for greatest effectiveness
- Need to respond to significant community /stakeholder interest and desire to participate
- Representation of different voices / diversity
- Some groups have been working for some time / history
- Limited time frame
- The Commission will have the role of pulling concepts together / synthesizing, and approving final recommendations.
- Need for transparency
